




All about clouds

Match the pictures with the names of the different types of clouds and describe each one in the space given.





Lunar gardening

Prepare the soil and sow radish seeds a day or two after the full moon. Water them regularly and harvest after 60 days. Measure the length and circumference and note the details of the radishes.

Similarly prepare and sow radish seeds a day or two after the new moon. Water regularly and harvest after 60 days. Measure the length and circumference and note the details. Compare data with the radishes sown after full moon. Make your conclusions.

You can do the same experiment with fenugreek seeds. You may then compare the data of the root vegetable and the leaf vegetable.

Animal watching

Observe the dogs and cats and other animals in and around your home- note if there are any changes in their behaviour just before a storm or heavy downpour. How do they behave at the peak of summer and winter? You can also talk to your friends who have pets and ask them if they have observed strange behaviour during bad weather.

What about the birds and insects? Have you observed any patterns in their appearance or behaviour during rain or especially dry weather?
